Each year, we survey Committee for Sydney members to understand what matters to leaders across our city, and how we can work together on the most important issues facing Sydney.

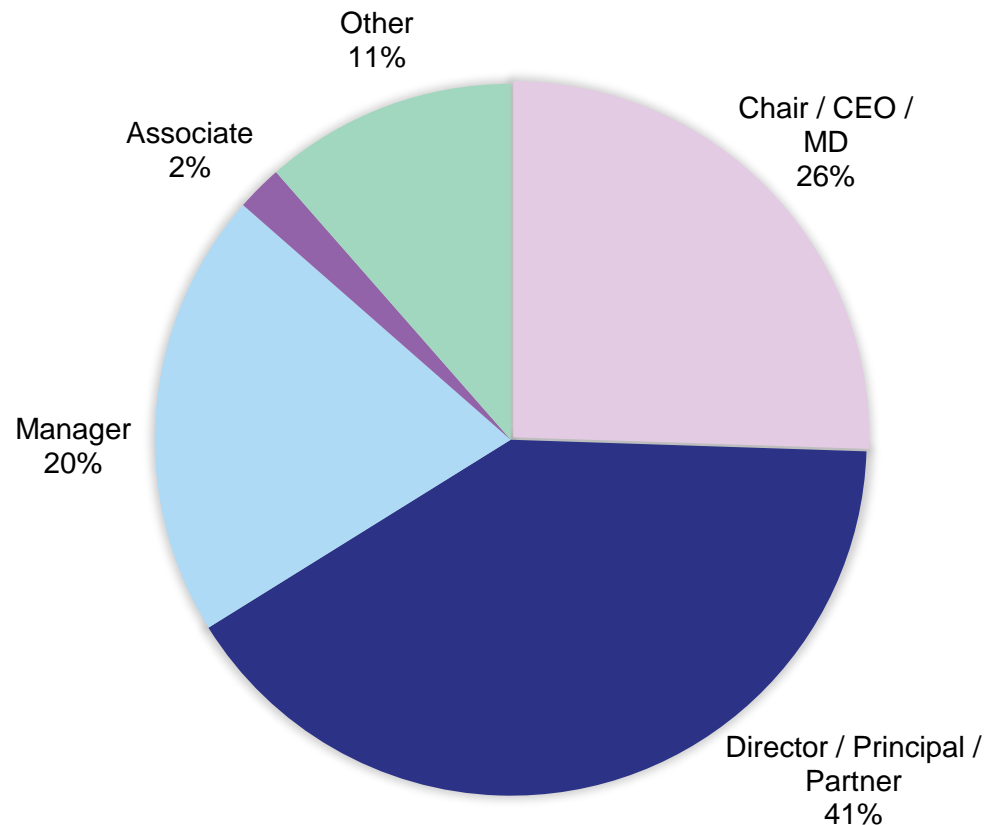
Sample:

- Distributed 6 August 2021, closed 18 August 2021
- Sent to 804 individuals from 151 organisations
- Results represent 201 responses from 131 organisations.

Organisations representing:

- More than 240,000 jobs in Sydney (full-time, part-time and contract)
- More than 630,000 jobs in Australia (full-time, part-time and contract).

Who responded?



The survey responses represent senior leadership and management (87%) at the employers of 240,000 Sydneysiders.

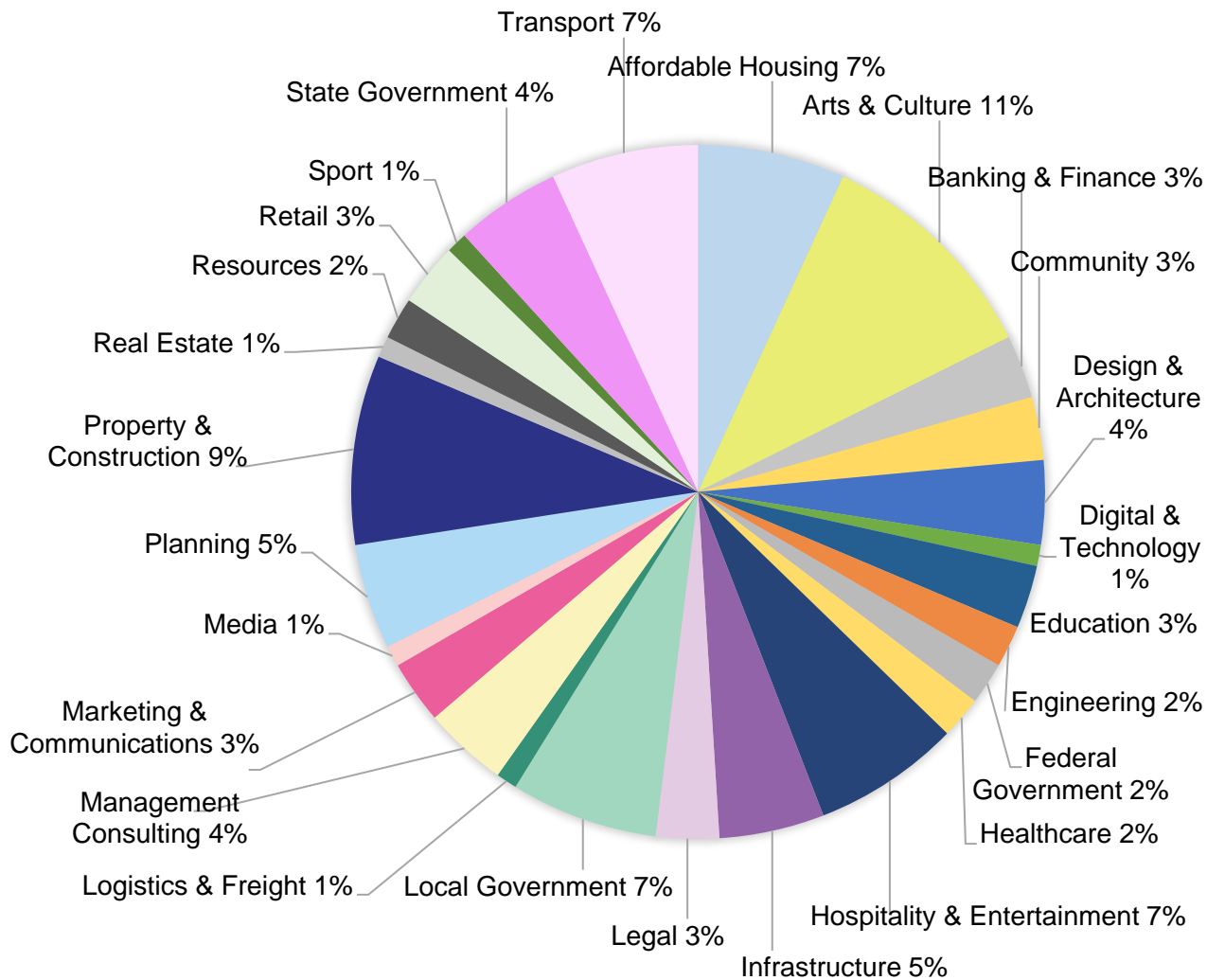
Independent impact

The Committee for Sydney is funded by more than 150 of Sydney's leading corporations, not-for-profits, government departments, and cultural and educational institutions.

In the 2021 survey, our members told us they support:

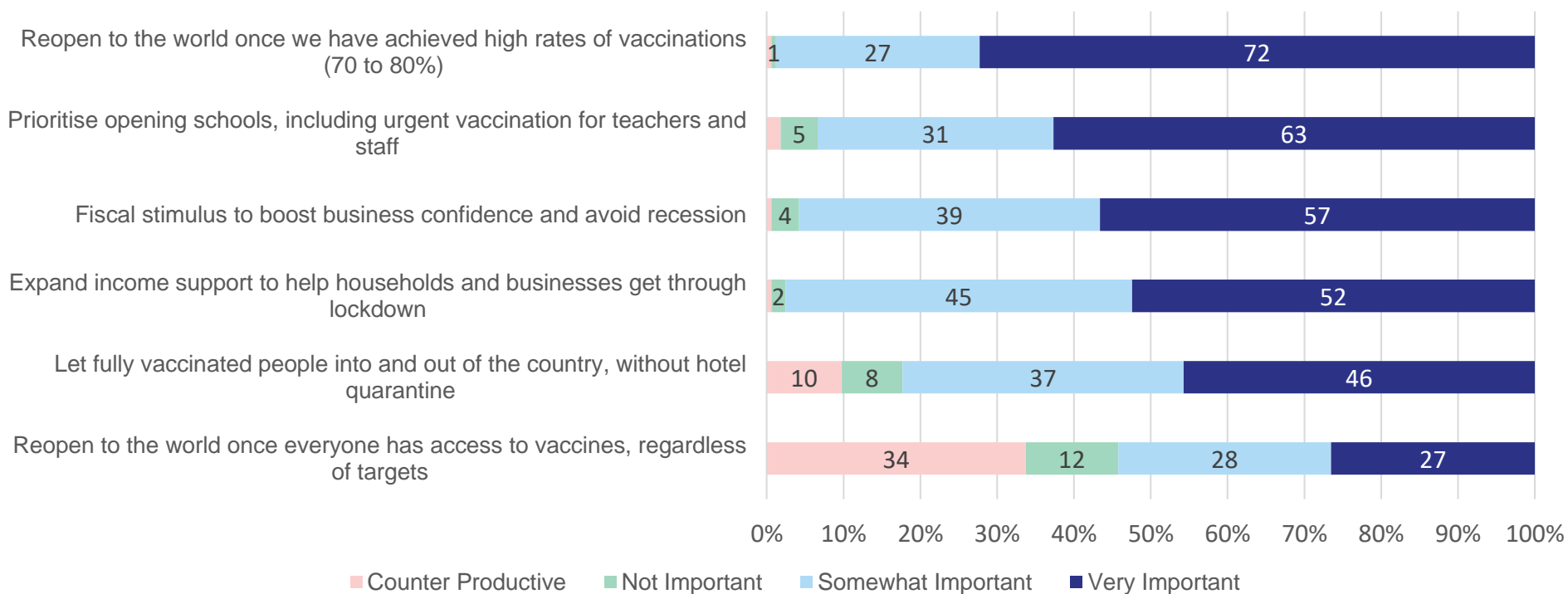
- reopening Sydney once we've achieved high rates of vaccination, and creating 'immunity passports'
- increasing funding for social/affordable housing
- adopting a net zero emissions target with legislation to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from each sector of the economy
- opportunities for innovation and economic growth through the transition to net zero.

More than 80% of our members rate the Committee's research, advocacy and events as strong or very strong.



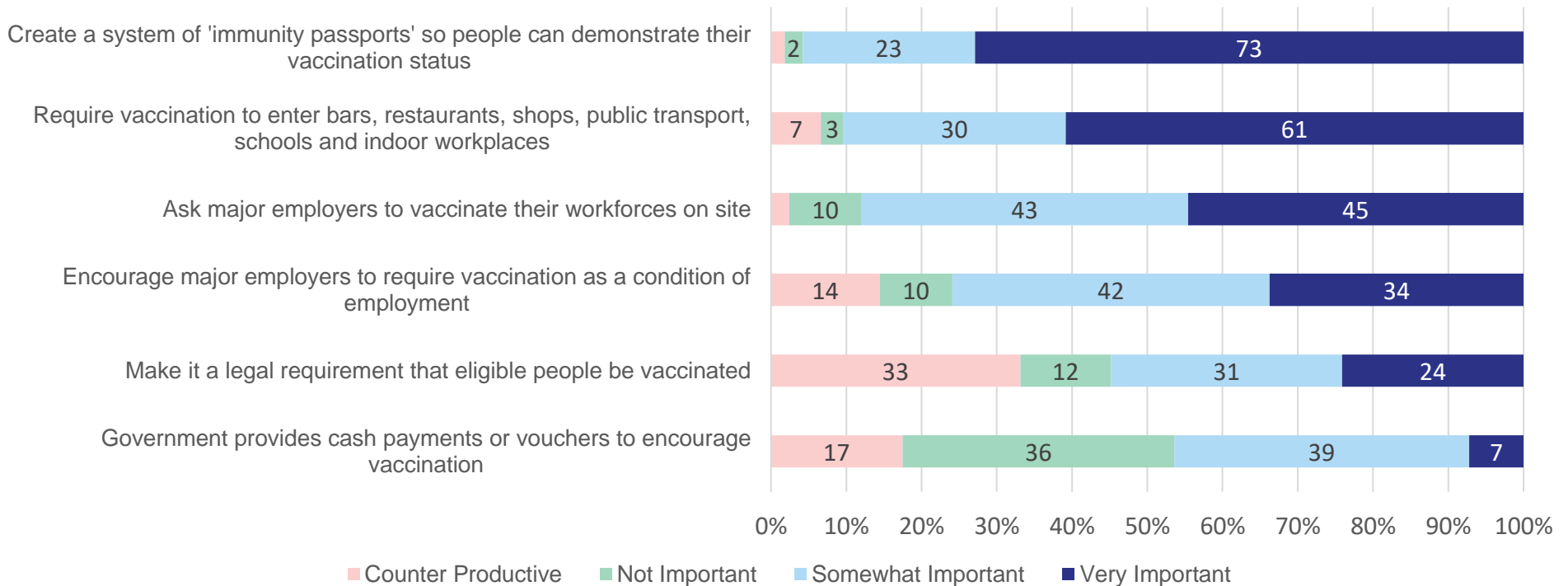
What are the most effective steps to reopen and recover from Covid-19?

We would like to understand your views on the most effective steps to reopen and recover from the Covid-19 lockdown:



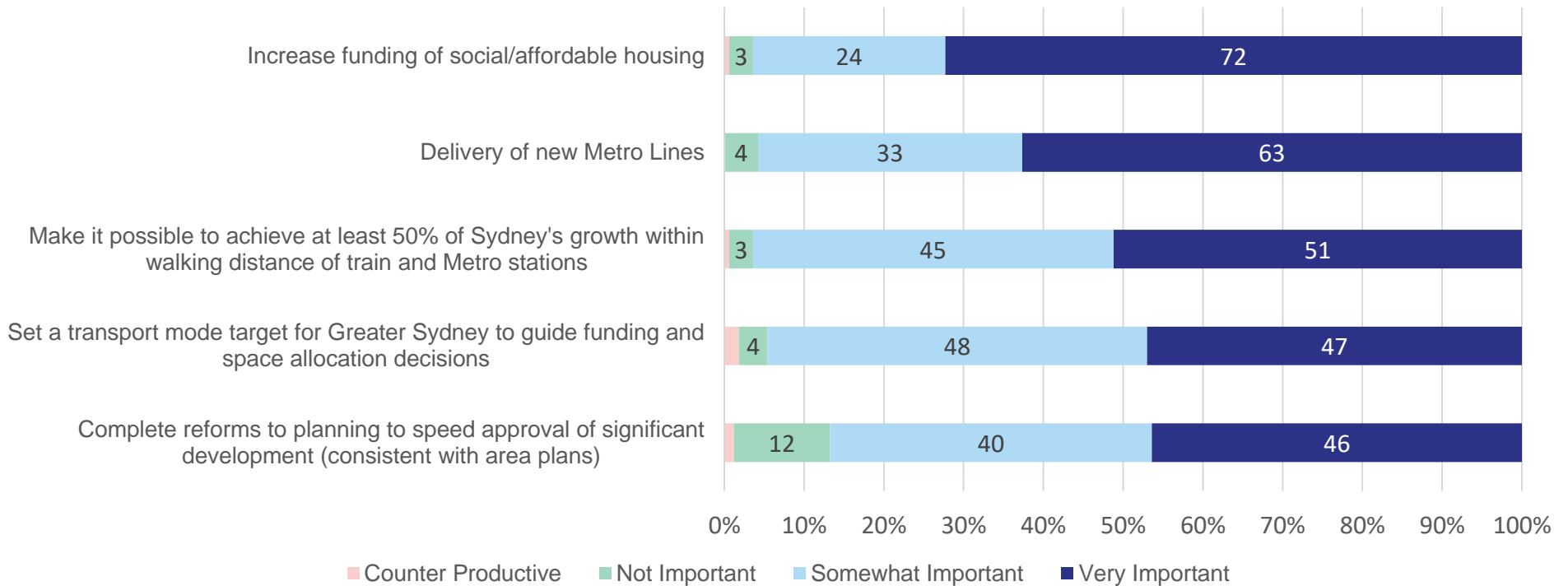
How should vaccines be incentivised?

To achieve a high level of vaccination, which of these measures do you support?



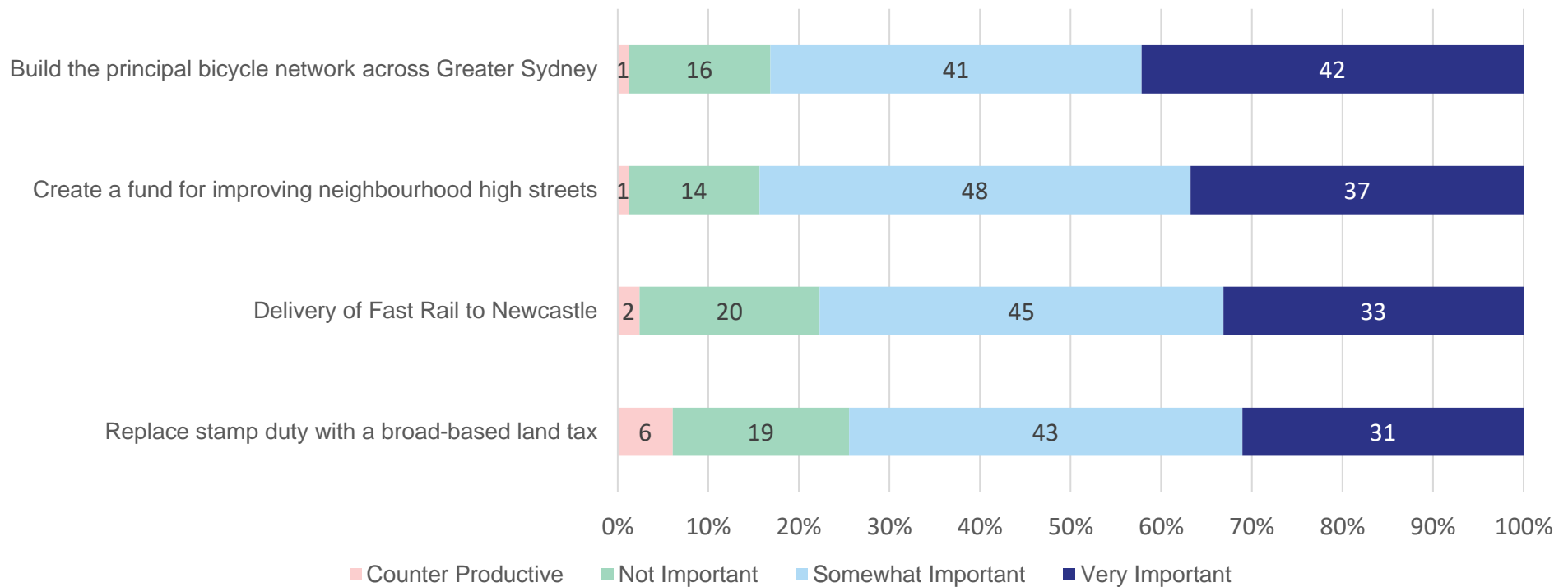

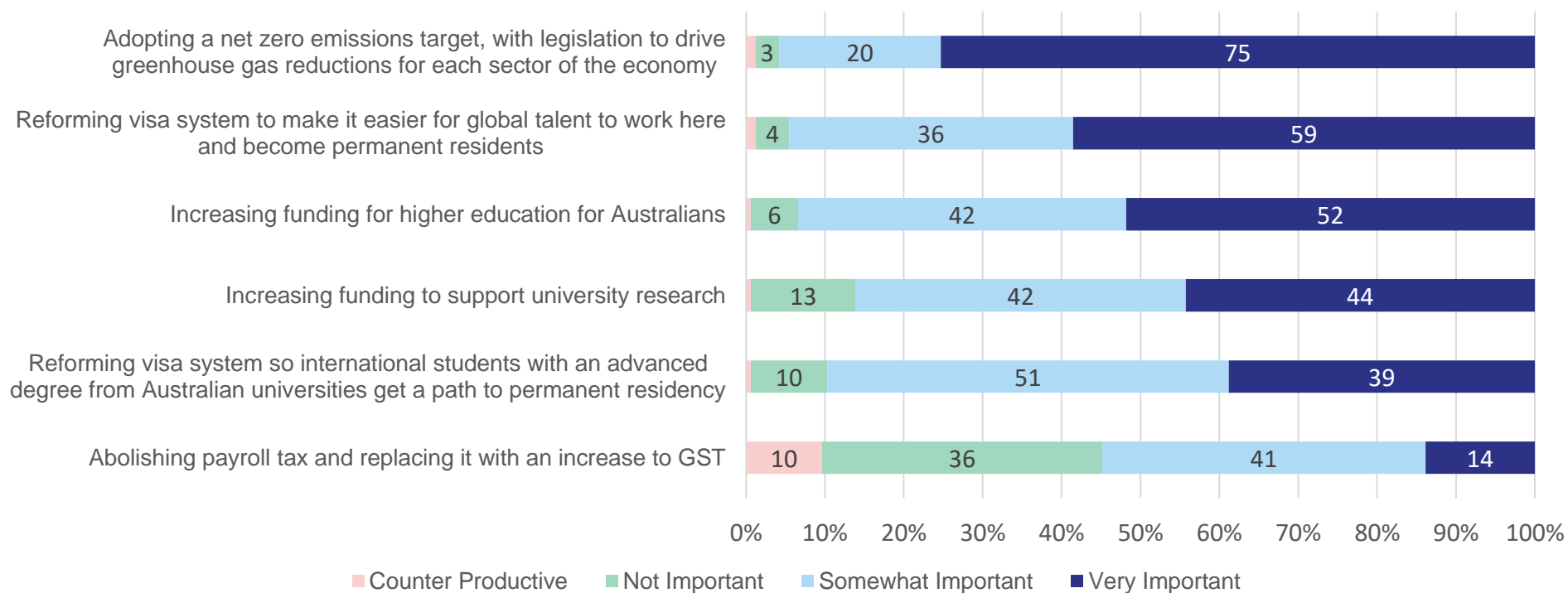

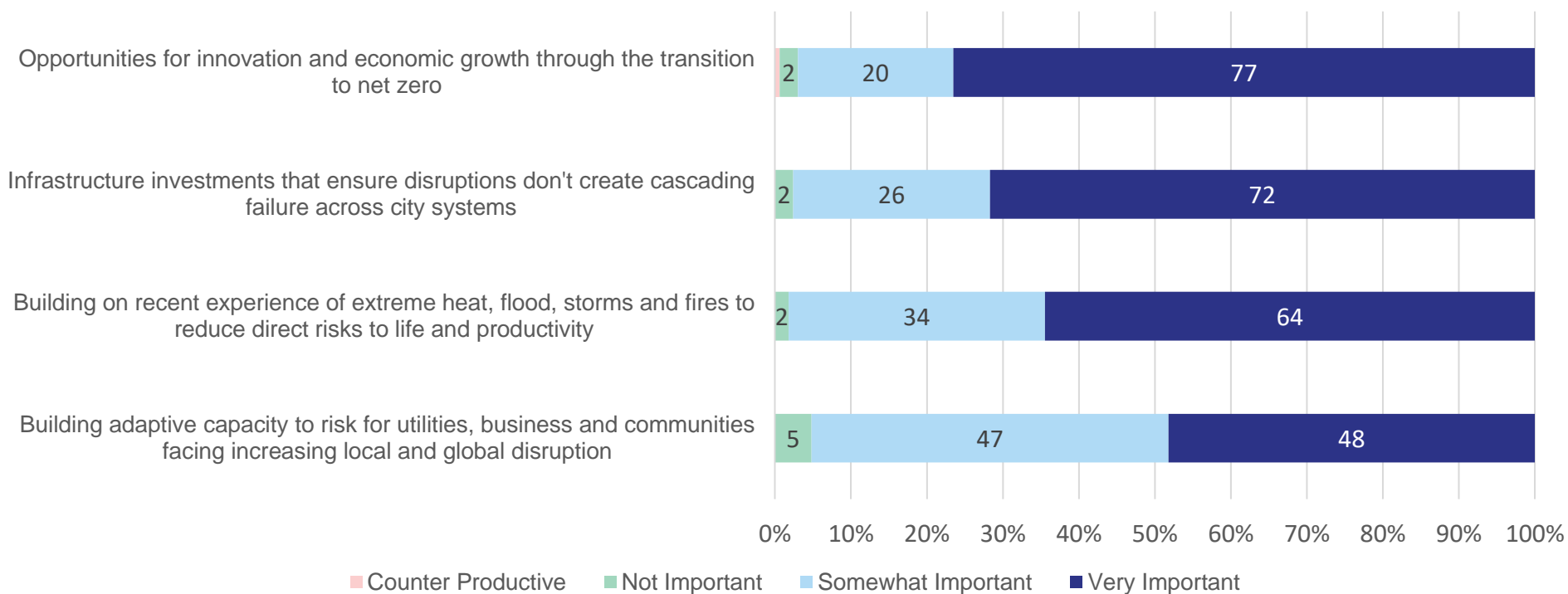

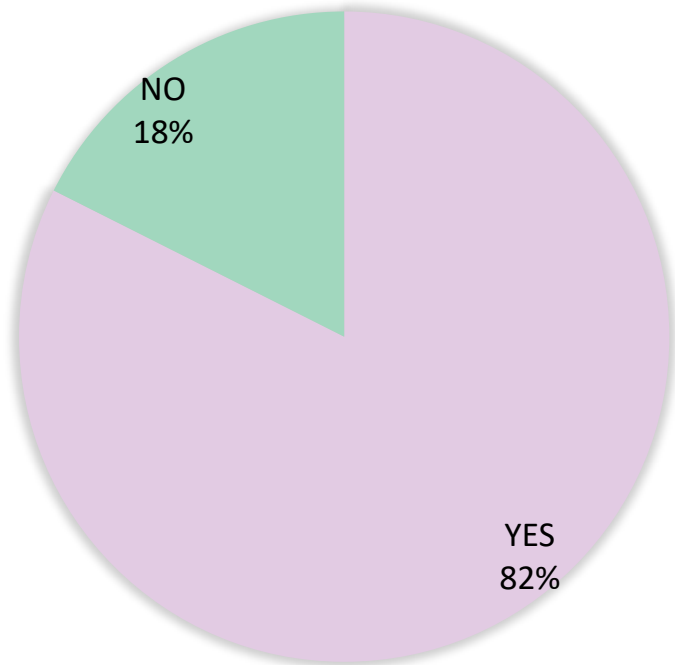

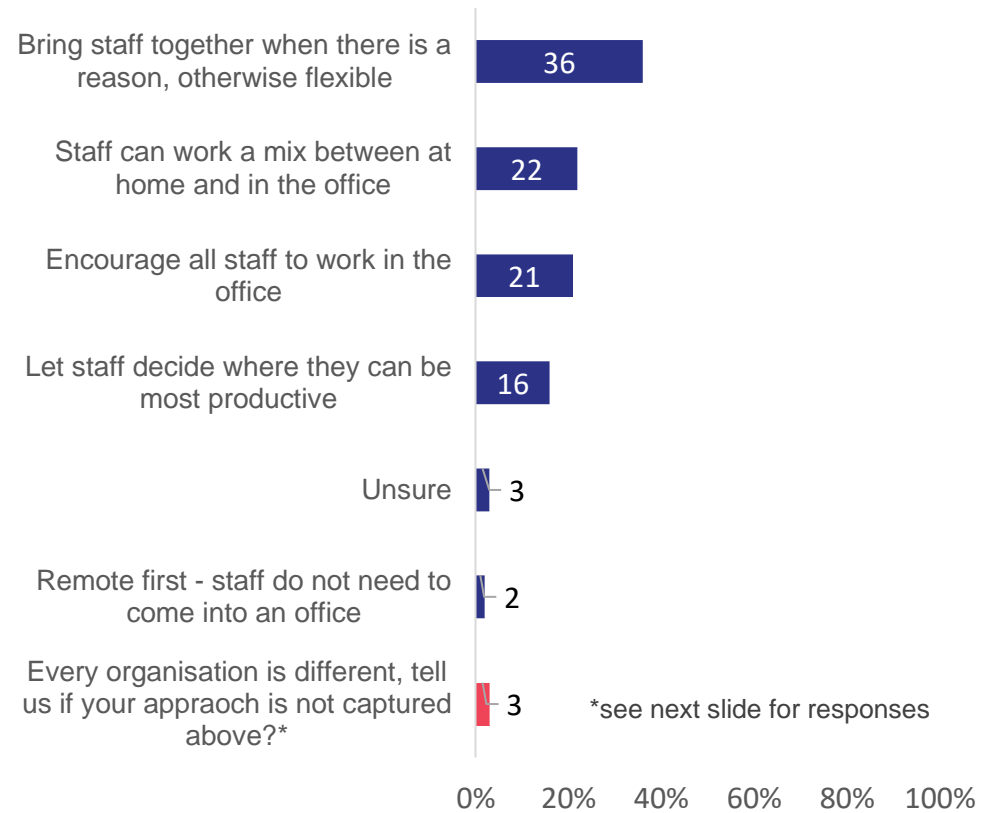


What will work in a post-Covid world look like?

Do you expect your organisation to permanently have more people working remotely in the post-Covid world?

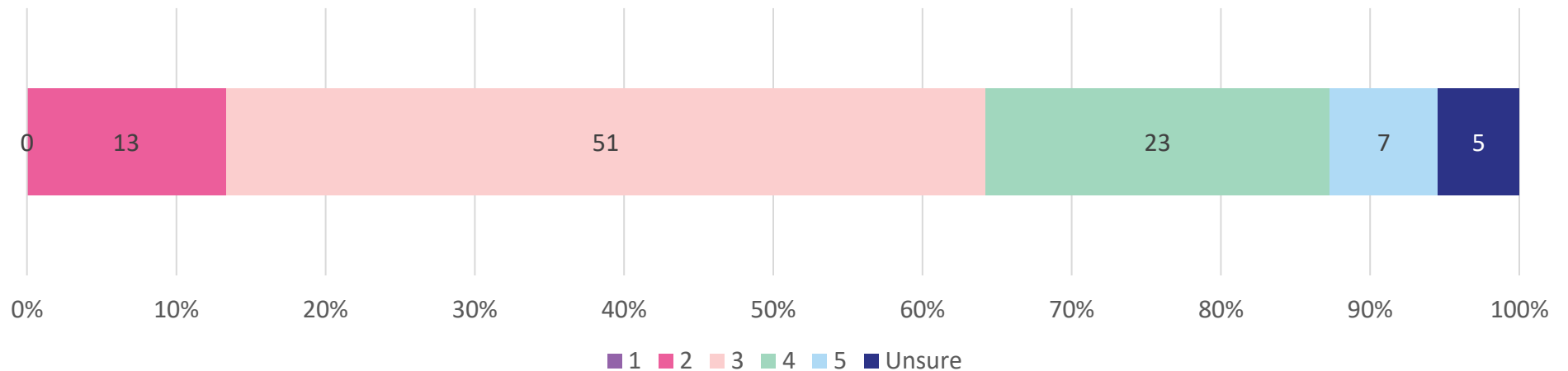


Thinking about your employees who worked in an office environment before Covid-19, which of these approaches most closely matches your organisation's approach to remote work in the future?



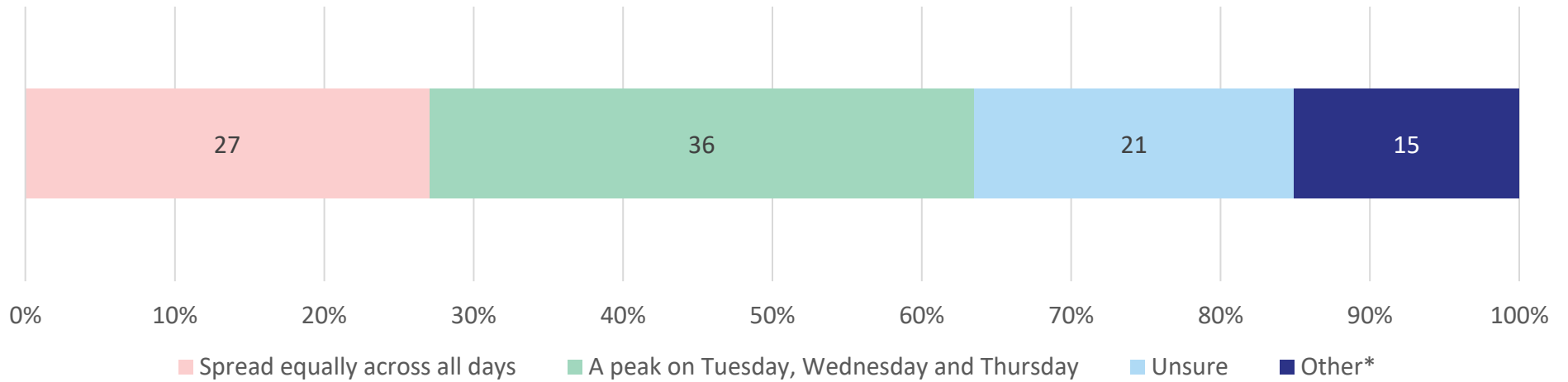
How many days a week will people work in the office?
