







Demographic distribution 2025











Would you consider living in an apartment in the future?




Q141. Why do you say that an apartment is not an appropriate place to raise a family?






How many spare rooms do you have?


















Would you change jobs for more flexibility?












Do you regularly participate in community activities?









Proportion of women who gave birth, by maternal age group










Q1. Thinking about your life in Sydney overall, how satisfied are you with your quality of life in Sydney?






Perceptions of liveability in Sydney








